SOCIAL DISTANCING OF ADULTS REMINDER

Please can we remind you to socially distance from other parents when you are waiting to drop or pick up your child? Can we ask that only one parent comes onto the playground for dropping and picking up? Please can you drop your child at the allocated time and do not stay on the school premises to wait or chat to other parents. Thank you for your co-operation with this. It is important that we work together to keep our school community as safe as possible.

COVID 19 TESTING

We are aware that there have been some significant problems with access to COVID-19 testing. You will have seen on the news that this is not unique to Devon but none the less is of significant concern. DCC and PHE have escalated this regionally and nationally but it is unlikely we will see a rapid improvement.

Individuals should only get tested if they have symptoms of coronavirus which are:

- A high temperature (feeling hot to touch on your chest or back)
- A new continuous cough (coughing a lot, for more than an hour or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours or if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- A loss or change to their sense of smell or taste (noticing you cannot smell or taste anything or things smell or taste different to normal)

Parents or carers of children attending school or school staff with symptoms of coronavirus should book a test as normal via the government website or by calling 119.

‘INCIDENT AT SCHOOL’ SCAMS

We have received reports in the Devon area of parents of being called on the phone, allegedly by their school, to say their child has been involved in an incident or taken ill. An example has been where a parent was called to say the child was ill and asked to dial 1 to be connected to right person to speak to. This child was at home that day so they knew it could not be correct so they attempted to ring the school but discovered the phone line had been held open reportedly to a high cost phone line. In another example the parents were asked to contact the school on the number provided, which again turned out to be a high cost phone line. School will normally contact you on the school line which is 01803832495. You can always call the school number back on this number if you are unsure or email the school.
