There will be certificates and rewards for those who take part.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS OVER THE CHRISTMAS HOLIDAYS

DCC have now put in place arrangements to provide supermarket vouchers to children across Devon who currently receive free school meals. The vouchers are for £30 per child (£15 per week) and can be used in a variety of supermarkets including Sainsburys, Tesco, Morrisons, Asda, M&S Food and Waitrose. Anyone who is eligible should ensure they look out for a letter or email from Devon County Council next week for details about how to access your vouchers or an alternative food box.

If you think you may be eligible due to a change in circumstance then please apply online through the <u>Devon Citizen's Portal</u> to check if you are eligible as soon as possible. This is the quickest and easiest way for your eligibility to be assessed and they will give you an instant decision. Alternatively, you can call the education helpline on **0345 155 1019**. To ensure that you receive the free school meals holiday vouchers for this Christmas period you must apply by Friday 18 December 2020.

Please note that this is a different arrangement to the Universal Free School Meals scheme where the children get a free meal in school years Reception, 1 and 2 because of age (not income).

DARTMOUTH LIBRARY - WINTER MINI CHALLENGE

The Winter Mini Challenge launched on Tuesday 1st December and runs until Friday 15th January 2021. To take part in the Winter Mini Challenge online, simply read any books (including eBooks and audiobooks) of your choice, then rate and review them at www.wintermini.org.uk. Books added to the website during the six-week Mini Challenge period will count towards unlocking special rewards including a certificate and a virtual badge. The website will feature activities, recommendations for great winter reads, and competitions. COVID 19 TESTING

We are aware that there have been some significant problems with access to COVID-19 testing. You will have seen on the news that this is not unique to Devon but none the less is of significant concern. DCC and PHE have escalated this regionally and nationally but it is unlikely we will see a rapid improvement.

Individuals should only get tested if they have symptoms of coronavirus which are:

- A high temperature (feeling hot to touch on your chest or back)
- A new continuous cough (coughing a lot, for more than an hour or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours or if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- A loss or change to their sense of smell or taste (noticing you cannot smell or taste anything or things smell or taste different to normal)

Parents or carers of children attending school or school staff with symptoms of coronavirus should book a test as normal via the government website or by calling 119.

If they are unable to book a local testing slot then individuals should complete the appropriate forms by following the links below:

NHS/Health/Care workers: NHS/Health/Care Professionals
All other individuals: Urgent Referral Form - Adults
